Nathan from the City talked about SNAPs we got a hand out of what Neartown submitted for SNAPs in 2009 to review of the original submissions from all montrose neighborhoods, 12 fell under 311 guidelines 1 was a CIP 4 did not fit any category 13 (?) were sent in under SNAP requests

Jeron from Wanda Adams's office talked about SNAPs and security

Office Wayne Pate from our storefront gave a recent crime / cop update between 2:00-4:00 this very day, they got 6 guys for narcotics, possession, parole violation VICE will be working intensely in our area soon HPD is pushing Citizens on Patrol; Wayne does the training Parking Management may be the culprit for parking tickets, not HPD

Jason Ginsberg from First Montrose Commons talked about the recent murder / dumping Our area should not be somewhere where criminals feel safe

Jonathan Smulian talked about Houston's Historid District - A Design Guild" and proposed ordinance Houston has the weakest protection ordinance in Texas, and probably in the U.S. we are loosing 2 ½ old / historic buildings a week - will wipe them all out in just a few years he is proposing guidelines, not requirements

try to keep new construction compatible with size, design, etc., of existing architecture in any given block includes neighborly & environmental considerations it's on the City's website; no hard copies available due to budget constraints pressure is greater in Montrose than in the Heights for higher density Montrose has 7, maybe 8 Historic Districts, out of the City's total of 14
