 - Increasing traffic
 - Neighborhood petitions for city services not getting adequate consideration
- Lack of rule/law enforcement
 - Bicycle safety concerns
 - Cut-through traffic and speeding on residential streets (including large trucks)
 - Minimum setbacks and lot sizes concern that developers will prevail with variances
- Need for improved neighborhood security
