1). METRO Transit System Reimagining Update -- José Pulido, Metropolitan Transit Authority The new plan will be a simpler, 7 day a week plan with improved weekend and evening travel options and better connections. Metro is continuing to hold public meetings and anticipates all feedback to the Reimaging Plan by July 31, 2014. Input will be considered and a final plan presented to the Board in the fall. Metro has speakers for neighborhood associations to discuss the Reimagining process and status and gather feedback.

- Richmond Rail, Houston Tomorrow, and others succeeded in getting 1000 letters in support of
 Rail sent to Congressman Poe and the other Houston representatives to assist in rescinding
 Congressman Culberson's appropriations bill exclusion of any funds for rail on Richmond or
 Post Oak. The effort was unsuccessful in the House. Anticipate additional support letters will be
 needed as the House/Senate conference committee takes up the bill.
