Meeting called to order by Greg LeGrande at 7:00 pm

- 1. State Rep. Sarah Davis spoke about the elections, particularly the constitutional amendment retransportation involving money to build and maintain our state roads. The amendment would allow diverting ½ of the money bound for the state's rainy day fund to pay for these improvements \$1.8 billion
- 2. Treasurer's report by Mark Johnson with Neartown \$7,756.52 balance.
- 3. Lloyd Matzner talked about the infrastructure subcommittee and Projects for Neartown, such as CIPs. Handouts of ongoing projects were distributed.
- Jason Ginsberg of the Montrose Management District gave a report on their security committee Cameras in parking lots, and general security information. Jason discussed the 8<sup>th</sup> annual Pub Crawl this Friday, Halloween.
- 5. Discussion re the Neartown Business Alliance is considering updating / upgrading the "M", which everyone thinks is the gateway to Montrose, since it is located in Montrose, but the BA claims it is for the gateway to the Museum District, which is south of here.

Projects of \$25,000 or less, come from the local civic clubs, but have to go through the Super Neighborhood.
