President Greg LeGrande called the meeting to order at 7:05.

1. Introductions- 20 people were in attendance; of which several were candidates for City Council, District C.

Daphne Scarbrough, Greg Meyers, Shelley Kennedy, Abbie Kamin. Each spoke briefly about their candidacy.

2. Crime Stoppers of Houston—Delayed to latter meeting time.

3. Update on TIRZ 27 Special Board Meeting from July19 on Montrose Collective Project at Westheimer and

Montrose. Discussion on plans that would alleviate some of Montrose parking problems:

Construction of a parking structure at the NE corner now housing the HPD storefront area and restaurants that

would accommodate 589 parking spaces. The Montrose TIRZ is reviewing the offset of 50% of the 77 spaces

being built above those required by the City of Houston.

City Council voted to expand the city's "market-based parking area" to cover portions of Midtown and East

Downtown in addition to the existing Central Business District. MBP(no parking requrements) is an attempt to

bring walkability to neighborhoods by encouraging visitors to arrive without their vehicles. Steve Longmire updated

his experience with dealing with ongoing difficulties that Montrose Commons and other areas are experiencing

and further expecting in line with the "market-based parking" development.
